

## ANNOTATED BIBLIOGRAPHY

Fay, William and Anna Marie Edgemon. *Share Jesus Without Fear Leader's Guide*. Nashville: LifeWay Press, 1997.

The four week witnessing course prepares believers to use a marked New Testament to present the gospel. The schedule can also be adapted for an all day training workshop or for a retreat setting. The resource includes a workbook, leader's guide, audiocassette, and a video. Training sessions involve the participants in role playing to practice sharing the gospel. The resource does not include a visitation plan.

Global Partners. *EvangeCube<sup>®</sup> Complete Church Training Kit*. Franklin, Tenn.: EvangeCube International, 2004.

The *EvangeCube<sup>®</sup>* is a seven-picture cube witnessing tool designed to help communicate the gospel. The kit provides multiple training formats which include half-day, six week, and weekend training schedules to equip believers. Also included in the kit are Bible study resources for adults, youth, and children for teaching class members how to use the cube over a two week period. Each session is accompanied by a visitation plan for on the job training.

Home Mission Board. *Continuing Witness Training Pastor/Leader Manual*, rev. ed.. Alpharetta, Ga.: Home Mission Board of the Southern Baptist Convention, 1982.

The Home Mission Board which is now known as the North American Mission Board of the Southern Baptist Convention produced *Continuing Witness Training* during the early 1980's. The resource was only available to pastoral leaders after attending a certified CWT Seminar. Currently, the thirteen week resource is not being published and certification seminars are not being held; however, NAMB will provide a set of the materials for reproduction. *Continuing Witness Training's* objective is to be used as a method to equip believers how to share the gospel using a lengthy presentation of the gospel. *CWT* training typically occurs on a week night for two and a half hours and includes visitation.

Kennedy, D. James. *Evangelism Explosion*. Wheaton, Ill.: Tyndale House Publishers, 1970.

D. James Kennedy, pastor of the Coral Ridge Presbyterian Church in Fort Lauderdale, Florida, is president and founder of Evangelism Explosion International. *EE* materials are resourceful tools to help pastors equip believers to share the gospel. Participants typically meet for training led by the pastor on a week night for two and a half hours. The twelve week training cycle includes visitation. Participants are placed on teams of three with each team being led by an experienced soul winner.

LifeWay Church Resources. *A Journey in FAITH: Lead Teacher Guide*. Nashville: LifeWay Press, 1998.

The *FAITH Sunday School Evangelism Strategy* originated at First Baptist Church of Daytona Beach, Florida. The word "FAITH" is used as an acrostic to communicate the gospel. *FAITH* is an ongoing, comprehensive process which functions through the existing Sunday school. *FAITH* equips and mobilizes Sunday school classes to accomplish personal evangelism/soul winning, follow-up on new believers, assimilation/discipleship, reclamation of absentees, and ministry to regular attendees. *FAITH* requires clinic training along with the support and leadership of the pastor for implementation.

North American Mission Board. *The NET: Evangelism for the 21<sup>st</sup> Century*. Alpharetta, Ga.: North American Mission Board of the Southern Baptist Convention, 2000.

*The NET* is designed to equip believers to communicate the gospel by using their personal testimony. The resource provides flexible training plans to accommodate various church schedules. Training can be conducted on week nights for eight consecutive weeks, Sunday afternoons for eight consecutive weeks, or one day of training followed by eight consecutive weeks of visitation. *The NET* is adequately flexible to fit the various church strategies found in the twenty-first century church.

\_\_\_\_\_. *One-Day/One-Hour Witnessing Workshop*. Alpharetta, Ga.: North American Mission Board of the Southern Baptist Convention, 2003.

The *One-Day Workshop* is based on *The NET* approach developed to equip believers to use their personal testimony to share the gospel. The recommended schedule has eight sessions and includes visitation to engage participants in witnessing opportunities. The material is free and can be downloaded from the NAMB website.

The *One-Hour Workshop* can also be downloaded from the NAMB website for free. The training material is based on *The NET* approach which was developed to train believers to use their personal testimony to share the gospel. Due to the brief time of training, the participants are encouraged to arrive at the workshop with their personal

testimony already prepared. The workshop material is broken down into five sections and does not include a plan for visitation.

Tidwell, Jerry N. *Outreach Teams That Win: G.R.O.W.* Nashville: Convention Press, 1997.

The outreach plan emerged as an effort to build winning teams of church members to grow a thriving and exciting church. *G.R.O.W.* participants are placed on four teams. Each team is assigned to serve one Tuesday evening per month. Each Tuesday evening the team is given visitation assignments, letter-writing assignments, and phone-call assignments. The method of outreach provides a gospel presentation to use while making evangelistic visits; however, other presentations could be employed in its place.
