Church Development Strategies

The African-American Church Development Department employs the following strategies for developing churches in the African-American community: minister of education training initiatives, educational leader network groups, consultant/coaching relationships with pastors and leaders, regional pastoral network clusters, and regional church development training.

Church Development Training Assistance

The African-American Church Development Department collaborates with other divisions of the FBC in order to address the cultural and diverse needs of our constituency. Training assistance includes, but is not limited to the areas of Sunday school, leadership development, pastoral staff development, Christian education, discipleship training, church administration, family ministry, missions, stewardship, and evangelism.

Associational Assistance
